Group Program Chair Report 2015 - Asbjorn Jokstad



For the 2015 IADR meeting in Boston, MA, the prosthodontics research group co-sponsors one symposium. Forty submitted abstracts will be presented in 7 oral sessions and 156 posters will be displayed in 8 poster sessions.

The symposium is titled: "**Is Edentulism Disappearing? Implications for Dental Care and Education.**" and is sponsored by the BEHSR (Behavioral, Epidemiologic and Health Services Research) and Prosthodontics groups. The symposium is organized on Wednesday 11.3: 3:15 p.m. -4:45 p.m. in room 206

The IADR head office initially identified approximately 210 abstract as directly related to prosthodontic research. Following some exchanges of abstracts between the various IADR research groups, 206 abstracts were distributed to Drs. Cortino Sukotjo, Dan Nathanson, David Bartlett, Matthias Kern, Steve Rosenstiel and Wael Att for independent critical appraisal in duplicate. Consensus on abstract rejection or inclusion was excellent. There was only need for arbitration by the group program chair of a small proportion of disagreements. All abstract rejections were satisfactory justified and the submitters received constructive criticism of the multiple reasons for the abstract rejection. In the end, 10 abstracts were rejected yielding 196 abstracts to be presented, of which 40 (20 %) are oral presentations and 156 (80 %) are posters.

Based on the abstract contents, the 196 abstract have been clustered within different topic headings. Obviously, applying nosology to prosthodontics research domains is a challenge on its own and merging small numbers of abstracts with somewhat diverging research focus under meaningful headings is another.

Frechette Award - Stephen Rosenstiel



The winners of the 2014 Frechette Awards were presented at the International Association for Dental Research annual meeting in Cape Town, South Africa. The Frechette is the annual research competition for new investigators sponsored by the Prosthodontics Group of the International Association for Dental Research and honoring the memory of Arthur R. Frechette who served as Secretary-Treasurer of the IADR from 1968 until 1977. The winners were **Dr. Hiroko Ogawa, Osaka University Graduate School of Dentistry, Suita-city, Osaka, Japan** for "Vertical Bone Augmentation Using iPS Cell Constructs with Simvastatin" and Dr. Beatriz Gimenez Gonzalez, University Complutense of Madrid, Madrid, Spain for "Accuracy and Repeatability of Intra-oral Scanners for Full-arch Implant Impressions". Ogawa and Gimenez Gonzalez each received a check for \$1000 thanks to the generous support of the Whip Mix Corporation.

We had 20 submissions for the **2015** Arthur R. Frechette Research Awards in Boston. From these, 6 finalists were selected by past-presidents of the Prosthodontics Group for the 2 awards. One award is for Prosthodontic research undertaken with a Materials Science or Bioengineering oriented protocol and the other is for Prosthodontic research undertaken with a Biological Sciences and Tissue Engineering oriented protocol. Researchers carrying out original research are eligible for the Frechette Award if they have been the primary author of no more than three articles published in refereed dental journals. Each award carries a cash prize of \$1,000.

Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Awards 2014 and 2015 Preview

Since 2007, the Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Award for Young Investigators recognizes original research by new investigators in the multidisciplinary field of pre-prosthetic or prosthodontics-related regenerative science, including tissue engineering, bone, tooth and soft-tissue regenerative sciences, graft materials research, maxillofacial reconstructive biology and physiology and implant biological

research. The awards are co-sponsored by the IADR Prosthodontics Group and Japan Prosthodontic Society.

The papers accepted in the Prosthodontics Group Poster Session (either oral or poster presentation) are eligible for the awards, and the selected finalists are asked to submit a 5-page extended abstract.

The 2014 First Place Winner was awarded to **Dr. Haruki Yamamoto** at Osaka University Graduate School of Dentistry, Japan, for his work entitled "Fabrication of Biomimetic Bone Graft Materials Using iPS Cells".

The Second Place Award went to **Dr. Kazuo Takeuchi** at School of Dentistry, Aichi-Gakuin University, for his work on "Histomorphometric Evaluation of Bone around Titanium Implants with Therapeutic Ultrasound".

For 2015 Boston Meeting, 10 finalists have been selected. The first and second place winners will be announced in the PRG Business Meeting on Thursday, 5 PM, March 12th.

IADR Prosthodontics Group Student Research Fellowship - Wael Att



The 2014 IADR Prosthodontics Group Student Research Fellowship was awarded to **Manrique Fonseca**, Prosthodontics Resident, Department of Prosthodontics, University of Freiburg during the group's business meeting at the IADR General Session in Cape Town. His research project entitled "Influence of ultraviolet photofunctionalization on surface characteristics of old and new titanium implants" competed with other research proposals submitted by different research groups and was finally selected as recipient of the fellowship. The proposals were judged and rated by reviewers with renowned research expertise for novelty, originality, multidisciplinary nature and scientific value. Final selection was made for the proposal with the highest score provided by the reviewers.

I would like to thank all applicants for the submission of high-quality research proposals and further encourage all research groups to apply for this fellowship. I also thank all reviewers for accepting the time-consuming task of evaluating and rating of multiple high-quality research proposals. The continuous support of Vita of this fellowship is highly appreciated.

The IADR Prosthodontics Group Student Research Fellowship is administered by the IADR Prosthodontics Group (PG) and co-sponsored by VITA Zahnfabrik and PG. This fellowship has been created in 2010 to encourage dental students, residents, and graduate students to consider careers in oral health research related to the topic of Prosthodontics. Proposals are sought in any category of research related to Prosthodontics.

The fellowship consists of a cash prize of \$3,000 + travel funds up to \$1500, with the funds being used to support direct costs for the research and travel/accommodations to present at an annual IADR General Session & Exhibition. The results of the research are to be presented at an annual IADR meeting within two years of receiving the fellowship, by submitting an abstract within the Prosthodontics Group for a poster or oral presentation.

The 2015 fellowship recipient will be announced at the Prosthodontics Group Business meeting on Thursday, March 26: 5:00- 6:00 pm during the IADR General Session in Boston.
