I am pleased to see that many members of Prosthodontic Research Group registered for the 90th General session of IADR, held at Iguacu Fall in Brazil, more than expected. I am also very honored that there are galaxy of superior presentations dealing with cutting-edge prosthodontic researches including nano-material science, nano-technology, regenerative tissue control, and rehabilitation of oral function. During the past decade, IADR Prosthodontic Research Group has been

developing and presenting a novel concept of prosthodontics based upon multidisciplinary approaches combining nano-materials, nano-technology and biology. We are leading a small world of dental science to practical health sciences and to a field of essential science.

I apologize I could not attend the last IADR meeting at San Diego. Furthermore, I apologize to all officers for my irresponsible act. I couldn't discharge my duties as President in this term. In the first two weeks after the earthquake, we had to send many staffs continuously. Afterword, numerous dentists came from all over Japan to help us. I took a responsibility for these operations as a leader of the dentists. Some are still on-going. I have also been involved in various operations like as investigation on health stage of refugee, recovering planning of health support, construction of identification system of unidentified dead, so on. The most high-priority issue has been to recover the buildings and resources of research and education of my dental school.

After the earthquake, I have spent incredibly busy and serious days, which I could not imagine. But I could not remember the details. I am still in hard and busy situation. A lot of emergent works things beat on me in waves. However, a few days later, I am going to Iguassu Falls to return the medal of President and express my sincere apology to the members. I appreciate all officers for their supports from the heart, especially to Professor Cortino Sukotjo, Secretary of our group.

I hope you will enjoy the fruitful scientific meeting and the world famous scenery of Iguassu Falls.

The IADR head office initially identified 169 abstract as directly related to prosthodontic research. Following a closer scrutiny, only 2 abstracts were re-allocated to other IADR groups. Hence, 167 abstracts were distributed online to Drs Waet Att, Dan Nathanson, Stephen Rosenstiel, Christian Stappert and Mohammed Zahran for independent critical appraisal in duplicate. Consensus on abstract rejection or inclusion was excellent. There was only need for arbitration by the group program chair of a small proportion of disagreements. All abstract rejections were satisfactory justified and the submitters received constructive criticism of the multiple reasons for the abstract rejection.

In the end, 10 abstracts were rejected yielding a total of 157 abstracts to be presented, of which 36 (23%) are oral and 121 (77%) are poster presentations. 102 (65 %) of the presentations in the prosthodontics group are from our host country Brazil. Japan and USA contributes with 11 presentations each, while there are 7 from China.

IADR Treasurer's Annual Report 2010 Brian O'Connell

IADR Audit Report

The Association's auditors, issued an unqualified opinion on the IADR financial statements for the year ending 31st December 2009.

2010 Budget

- The year 2009 ended with a greater than anticipated surplus of \$240,991, so 2010 started on a strong basis.
- Largely due to Barcelona Annual Session, and a surge in membership (12,000)
- Overall, 2010 should end with a surplus in the region of \$500,000 (12% of total income),
- At this point, a positive balance of approximately \$100,000 is projected for 2011 and \$50,000 for 2012. This is largely due again to surpluses from meetings rather than from Dues.
- Membership increased in 2010 to 12434, growing in all regions except North America..

IADR Asset

- As low as 5.5 Million\$ 3 years ago but now stand at just less than 8 Million Dollars
- Portfolio reviewed and this seems to be working in the right direction
- The *Journal of Dental Research* In 2010 the JDR is expected to produce a surplus for IADR/AADR of \$151,964, but under current assumptions this surplus will decline year on year.

Medium to long term outlook

As well as a better-than expected year in 2010, the medium term financial prospects for IADR have improved.

Members Dues and meeting costs

In 2012 there will be an increase in member dues of 15\$, middle tier 5\$, low income 6\$ - student dues up by 5\$. There will be similar increases in 2013. Cost of Registration fee will increase by 2% 2012 for members – but there will be a local member rate (50% of normal rate – and 75% for students)

Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Awards Keiichi Sasaki

Pre-Prosthetic Regenerative Science Award for Young Investigators was established in 2007 under the leadership of Dr. Takahiro Ogawa, the immediate past President. The award recognizes original research by new investigators in the multidisciplinary field of pre-prosthetic or prosthodontics-related regenerative science, including tissue engineering, bone, tooth and soft-tissue regenerative sciences, graft materials research, maxillofacial reconstructive biology and physiology and implant biological research. The awards are co-sponsored by the IADR Prosthodontics Group and Japan Prosthodontic Society. Awards are presented during the annual business meeting of the group during the IADR General Session.

The First Place Winner 2011 was awarded to Dr. Ken Ishizaki. The Second Place Award went to Dr. William Custodio.

For 2012 Iguassu Falls Meeting, 3 finalists have been selected. The first and second place winners will be announced in the Prosthodontic Group Business Meeting.

IADR Prosthodontics Group Student Research Fellowship-Wael Att

The 2010 IADR Prosthodontics Group Research Fellowship, presented for the first time at the IADR General Session in Barcelona, Spain, proved to be an outstanding success and demonstrated high interest in this fellowship. Fourteen high-quality research proposals from different categories related to prosthodontics were submitted and considered for the fellowship. The abstracts were judged and rated by 5 reviewers with renowned research expertise for novelty, originality, multidisciplinary nature and scientific value. The quality of the submitted proposals was based on their score. Final selection was for the proposal with the highest score provided by all reviewers. The 2010 fellowship recipient is Dr. Hiroki Kayashima, Department of Fixed Prosthodontics Osaka University, Graduate School of Dentistry for the work entitled "Application of Gingival Fibroblastderived Induced Pluripotent Stem (iPS) Cells to Bone Tissue Engineering". Dr. Kayashima will present the results of his research at an annual IADR meeting within two years of receiving the fellowship. The fellowship is co-sponsored by the IADR Prosthodontics Group and Vita Zahnfabrik, and consists of a cash prize of \$3,000.00 + travel funds up to \$1500.00, with the funds being used to support direct costs for the research and travel/accommodations to present at the IADR General Session & Exhibition.
